Internal estimated cost to replace roof, siding and windows would approach \$250,000.00. This does not address any space considerations. Before spending this amount for maintenance, a decision on potential building expansion needs to be made first. Recommend to go to Selectmen to authorize request, and then return to Capital Planning to discuss funding.
