(527 CMR 1 - 10.15.2 The AHJ shall be permitted to regulate all outdoor Events such as carnivals and fairs as it pertains to access for Emergency vehicles; access to fire protection equipment; Placement of stands, concession booths, and exhibits; and the Control of hazardous conditions dangerous to life and property.)

3) Fire Extinguishers.

Fire extinguishers are required for any vendor that cooks or uses a gasoline-powered generator. They are also required to be with in any tent that is permitted by the building department.

(527 CMR 1 - 50.4.4.1 Fire-extinguishing equipment shall include both automatic fire-extinguishing systems as primary protection and portable fire extinguishers as secondary backup.)

527 CMR 1 - 10.15.5 Portable Fire Extinguishers. A minimum of one portable fire extinguisher shall be provided for each concession stand where required by the AHJ in accordance with Section 13.6.

10.15.10.4 Fire Extinguishers. A minimum of one portable fire extinguisher with a rating of not less than 2-A:10-B:C shall be provided.

	The Massachusetts Building references the International Fire Code as a standard for Temporary and Permanent Tents and Membrane Structures
	IFC - 3104.5 Combustible materials. Hay, straw, shavings or similar combustible materials shall not be located within any tent or membrane structure containing an assembly occupancy, except the materials necessary for the daily feeding and care of animals. Sawdust and shavings utilized for a public performance or exhibit shall not be prohibited provided the sawdust and shavings are kept damp. Combustible materials shall not be permitted under stands or seats at any time.

5) Fire Department Access Roads.

Fire department access roads shall remain open and be 20' in width. Provide a layout of your event and how you plan to ensure that access is available to any affected building and the event. Said layout should be approved at least one month prior to event to account for changes that may need to be made.

Other considerations:

- a) Fire Department Sprinkler Connections shall remain accessible.
- b) Building services, electrical and gas shut offs shall remain accessible.

527 CMR 1 - 18.2.4.1.4 Entrances to fire department access roads that have been closed with gates and barriers in accordance with 18.2.4.2.1 shall not be obstructed by parked vehicles.

527 CMR 1 - 18.2.3.2.1 A fire department access road shall extend to within 50 ft (15 m) of at least one exterior door that can be opened from the outside and that provides access to the interior of the building.

527 CMR 1 - 18.2.3.4.1.1 Fire department access roads shall have an unobstructed width of not less than 20 ft (6.1 m).

8) Crowd Managers

Crowd managers are required for events which use a tent or temporary structure that the occupant load is more that 100 people and an additional crowd manager for every 250 occupants.

IFC - 3104.20.2 Crowd managers. There shall be trained crowd managers or crowd manager/supervisors at a ratio of one crowd manager/supervisor for every 250 occupants, as approved.

527 CMR 1 - 20.1.5.6.4 Fire and Building Safety Checklist.

- (1) The crowd manager shall be responsible for the completion of the Fire & Building Safety Checklist, as prescribed by the State Fire Marshal, on each day of operation prior to opening the facility to patrons.
- (2) This checklist shall include, but not be limited to, the routine safety check of existing fire protection systems, fire extinguishers, signage, interior finish, exits, unobstructed egress, crowd control procedures and building occupancy. limits.
- (3) The original completed checklists shall be kept on the premises for at least one year and shall be subject to inspection by the AHJ.

9) Communications Plan

10) Event Preplan

Provide a hazard assessment of the event and analysis of safety hazards the following items. The following items shall be included in the event preplan.

527 CMR 1 - 10.15.3.2 Life safety evaluations shall include an assessment of all of the following conditions and related appropriate safety measures:

- (1) Nature of the events and the participants and attendees
- (2) Access and egress movement, including crowd density problems
- (3) Medical emergencies
- (4) Fire hazards
- (5) Permanent and temporary structural systems
- (6) Severe weather conditions
- (7) Earthquakes
- (8) Civil or other disturbances
- (9) Hazardous materials incidents within and near the facility
- (10) Relationships among facility management, event participants, emergency response agencies, and others having a role in the events accommodated in the facility
