

RT 140 ROAD WORK PROJECT



WORCESTER ROAD FROM PRINCETON LINE TO HONEY BEE LANE Started in March and continuing through November 2025!

This is a very significant traffic project that will continue in multiple phases. The project began in early March and is currently ongoing with mostly Tree Work at this time. **The hours of operation for scheduled work are 7am-3pm daily**. Areas will be clearly marked with signage and roadways will remain open as is possible given the work being done. Please use caution in the work zones and expect dome delays. There will also be at least 3 weekends where RT 140 will be closed for an entire weekend to replace the culverts. Detour routes will be clearly marked. This will be a significant project that will affect our residents and commuters daily. The Police Department will share continued social media updates, road closures and detours as they need to be established in as much advanced notice as possible. Stay tuned and please share this information with others living in the work zone.





In case you didn't know: Rehab work on the 1 million gallon water storage tank on Goodridge Drive has been completed. The prestressed concrete water storage tank was built in 1970.

As the weather continues to transition from winter to spring, our crews are preparing for our **spring maintenance activities** (sweeping, roadside mowing, drainage pipe repairs, etc.)

We will also be starting back up and finishing our paving projects on **Nichols Street** and **Ellis Road** (Nichols to Carter). We expect to start these projects sometime in May/June.

EXCITING NEWS ON THE WAY SOON!

We are very close to breaking ground on our new Senior Housing Development, located behind the Senior Center.

What's Happening Behind Dunkin Donuts?

There has been a lot of talk about the new 'car wash' that is being built behind the DD/Subway Building. This post is to CONFIRM that yes, there is a car wash being put in that location. After extensive planning and many redesigns, this project was officially approved and has begun. In addition to the Car Wash, the parking lots and surrounding areas will undergo significant transformation to both change the traffic flow, as well as beautify the surrounding space.



DPW recently completed the installation of new signage aimed at promoting road safety for bicyclists and other vulnerable road users. The Vulnerable Road Users Laws went into effect in MA on 4/1/23. The laws require motorists to maintain a safe passing distance of at least 4 feet when overtaking vulnerable road users. In collaboration with MassDOT, the DPW has taken the initiative to install 65 signs throughout Town, ensuring that both bicyclists and drivers are aware of the new regulations.



As the weather begins to turn, we expect that the National Weather Service will begin to issue fire weather warnings and Red Flag days. Kindergarten screenings will take place May 21-23, 2024 during the school day (9:00 AM - 2:00 PM). Once your child is **fully registered** for kindergarten, you will receive a link to sign up for a screening slot. An orientation to the Kindergarten program (including classroom visits and a bus ride) will be scheduled in late August prior to the first day of kindergarten.


MONTHLY BOOK CLUB
