BOARD OF HEALTH

Food Festival and Food Truck Regulation in effect June 19, 2019

1. Food vendors and trucks are expected to comply with the State Sanitary Food Code or The Food Code, which is 105 CMR 590.00
2. Food vendors and trucks are expected to follow the direction of the Westminister Health Agents in a prompt and timely fashion as requested by the Health Agents. Failure to do so may result in a suspension or revocation of their Westminister Temporary Food Permit.
3. Food vendors or food trucks will be asked to stop serving food and leave the premises by the Westminister Board of Health and/or its Agents when they are in violation of the Massachusetts Food Code, specifically but not limited to the following Priority Violations:
 - a. No one on site holds a Food Manager Protection certification as required by The Food Code. Not all food vendors serve the type of food requiring this certification.
 - b. Sanitizer is not on site, not in use, or no knowledge of use as specified by The Food Code.
 - c. No thermometer on site, not in use or no knowledge of use as specified by The Food Code.
 - d. Refrigeration units are in failure by violating cold hold requirements in The Food Code.
 - e. Hot holding units are in failure by violating the hot holding requirements in The Food Code.
 - f. Verbal or physical intimidation of the food inspector.
4. Temporary Food Permits issued by Westminister Board of Health may be suspended or revoked by the Board of Health only or its' Health Agents.
5. If your Temporary Food Permit has been suspended or revoked, you may seek a hearing with The Westminister Board of health for reinstatement. Do so in writing within 10 days of your suspension or revoke status with the Town of Westminister.
